6. **Croft House Maintenance.**

7. **Report from the Management Committee**

It has been necessary to separate the insurance which covers UHCA and CHMC and all their activities. As a consequence of the changes, HIB as a sub-committee of UHCA, has been included in the UHCA policy. The benefits of this change are reduced costs and better insurance cover. The new insurance provider is Allied Westminster (Village-guard).

As the insurance is now separated into UHCA which covers HIB activity and CHMC insurance, it was discussed who should pay for what. However, as CHMC is responsible for recurrent expenditure and has paid all the insurance costs to date save for HIB and the Village Fete; Michael proposed that CHMC should cover all the insurance costs. Chris seconded this motion which was carried with no votes against.

The new insurance cover is extensive and an improvement on our previous policy but under the terms of the policy we need to review our Health and Safety issues and prepare Risk Assessments and Training Documents.

Thanks were extended to Roger and Michael for the extensive and involved work they undertook to sort this out.

The committee (CHMC) agreed to consider making a donation to UHCA for new chairs and maybe other items at the end of the financial year,

Roger and Andrea have been looking at chairs and will bring sample of coverings to the next meeting.
